HIBH RIBB - high level

Leave the car park at Legburthwaite (toilets available here) by the gate at the far end and turn left along a tarmac lane until you reach the A591 (555 bus stop Traveline tel: 0871 200 22 33). Turn right and cross over St. John's Beck. Walk a few yards along the road until you come to a ladder stile on your right, signposted to St. John's-in-the-Vale Church and Bridge House.

20 yards along the path fork left and start climbing. Shortly fork left again and continue to climb a zigzag path through mature oak and pine trees before finally reaching the ridge.

The views from the ridge are stunning: Blencathra and Skiddaw to the north and Helvellyn to the south. Follow the distinct path along the top. At the fence cross the stile and continue straight on, likewise with the ladder stile. Descend steeply on grass towards the church and Diocesan Youth Centre. Turn right when you get to the tarmac lane by the centre. (For a short walk follow the lane to 6

If you want to extend the walk turn left at a small stile in the wall by a stone shed, signposted to Tewitt Tarn. There is a well-trodden path to the Tarn. Walk around the Tarn, drop down to a





Turn right and walk down the road for about 1/4 mile. Turn right on a path signposted back to the church, by a small farm, Shundraw. This path brings you out on the lane leading back up the hill to St. John's Church.

Love Walk - just before you reach the church, turn left along a bridleway leading south back along the valley.

SHORT WALK - continue past the church, until you reach the bridleway sign on your right. Turn right and head south back along the valley.

Follow the bridleway which is actually the old coffin path, along the valley past the ruins of farmsteads at Rake How, Strawberry How and Sosqill. Continue through a plantation of larch, oak and Christmas trees, with its woodland trail.

The Tea Garden is here! Come and enjoy the generous portions of homemade cake.

Feeling refreshed, continue along the same path passing a rocky area that has a steep drop into the beck through more mature woodland. You will soon reach the main road again. Retrace your route back to the car park.

OLD COFFIN PATH - low level

- 1 Follow the instructions for High Rigg.
- Where the track forks for a second time go right, following the contour of the hill with
- Just beyond the Tea Garden and barn continue straight on at the finger post. This takes you through woodland. Through the second kissing wicket turn right and head towards Sosgill bridge (an old stone packhorse bridge). Before the bridge bear left. Continue through the fields, following a very defined route until you reach Bridge House. (about ½ hour)
- 4 Continue past Bridge House through fields following the signed footpath. This brings you onto a tarmac road at Yew Tree Farm
- Turn left at the road, past the farm and up the hill towards St. John's-in-the-Vale Church. From here pick up the High Rigg walk at 6 and make your way along the path back towards the Tea Garden and the car park.

THINGS TO LOOK FOR!

Among the fells and the fields you will see quarries, old copper and silver mines, two packhorse bridges and an impressive turf trod. There is an abundance of flora and fauna to be found on this walk. Here are a few examples, so keep your eyes open.
